NARRATIVE: On 03/11/04 Victim Michelle Newland came to CCPD to report a violation of Injunction. Victim Newland presented a valid injunction for protection against Suspect Goodyear. Between the date of the injunction 12/16/03 and 03/11/04, Suspect Goodyear emailed Victim Newland 181 times. He also left 18 messages on her vehicle and two (2) cassettes on her car. I obtained a taped statement from Suspect Goodyear's roommate (Devin Bazar) who stated he was a witness to Suspect Goodyear using his computer to contact Victim Newland. On 03/16/04 I spoke to Suspect Goodyear on the telephone. Suspect Goodyear stated to me he contacted Victim Newland in violation of the court order. He advised me he would turn himself in on 03/16/04 and again on 03/29/04 after making arrangements for his minor daughter. Suspect Goodyear failed to show on both dates. On 05/28/04 Suspect Goodyear arrived at CCPD and was arrested for Aggravated Stalking. Post Miranda Suspect Goodyear gave a taped statement in which he admitted sending over 180 emails, 18 letters and two cassette tapes to Victim Newland. Suspect Goodyear stated he was aware of a valid injunction in effect but still made contact with Victim Newland.

DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION: On 03/11/04 Victim Michelle Newland came to CCPD and filed a violation of injunction report on Suspect Michael Scott Goodyear.

Victim Newland stated that on 12/16/04 she obtained an injunction for protection from her ex-boyfriend Gregory Scott Goodyear. On 02/04/04 Suspect Goodyear began to contact Victim Newland via email. Between 02/04/04 and 03/11/04 Victim Newland received 181 emails. These emails originated from a screen-name of Devin Bazar. The content of these messages left no doubt in Victim Newlands mind that they came from Suspect Goodyear. In addition, eighteen (18) handwritten messages were left on Victim Newlands vehicle. These messages appeared on her vehicle at home, work and while grocery shopping. Lastly, two (2) cassette tapes were left at Victim Newlands residence. Victim Newland completed a sworn written statement and provided the 181 emails, the eighteen (18) handwritten notes and cassette tapes as evidence. This evidence was entered into CCPD evidence.

On 03/16/04 contact was made with Witness Devin Bazar. Witness Bazar is Suspect Goodyears current roommate. Witness Bazar came to CCPD and provided a sworn taped statement. Witness Bazar stated that he was aware that Suspect Goodyear was using his computer and email address to contact Michelle Goodyear. Witness Bazar further stated he was aware that an injunction preventing Suspect Goodyear from contacting Victim Newland was in effect.

On 03/16/04 at approximately 5:00 pm, contact was made with Suspect Goodyear via telephone by Officer Minnillo. During the conversation Suspect Goodyear told Officer Minnillo that he had contacted Victim Newland in violation of his court order. Suspect Goodyear stated that he needed to make arrangements for his minor daughter and that he would turn himself in to CCPD on 03/17/04 at 1:00 pm. Suspect Goodyear failed to show.

On 03/25/04 Suspect Goodyear contacted me via telephone and stated he took his daughter to Illinois to stay with family. He advised me he would be returning to Cape Coral and would turn himself in to me on 03/29/04. Suspect Goodyear failed to show again. I then completed an Open Booking Sheet against Suspect Goodyear for Aggravated Stalking.

On 05/28/04 Suspect Goodyear came to CCPD seeking to file a perjury charge against Victim Newland. Based on the open booking sheet Suspect Goodyear was taken into custody and placed under arrest.

Suspect Goodyear was processed at CCPD and read his Miranda Rights from a CCPD prepared card. He waived his rights and stated he was willing to give a taped statement. During the interview, Suspect Goodyear stated he was aware that a valid injunction was in effect. He further admitted to sending emails, placing messages and leaving cassette tapes for Victim Newland in violation of the court order.
